




THE STATE ATTORNEY GENERAL AND THE DIF (FAMILY SERVICES) ESTIMATES SHOW 8,318 ORPHANS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 IN THE STATE OF CHIHUAHUA AS A RESULT OF THE DRUG VIOLENCE.

An additional 10,000 children regularly show up at children's shelters or public soup kitchens. Most of these live without adult care in the cities. The State Government provides shelter only up to the age of 15 years old, which is still a critical age for physical, intellectual and moral development.



Guadalupe


We found Guadalupe through a civil complaint. Her mother committed suicide in a jail cell and her dad left her mom before she was born. She lived with an aunt, her mother's sister, where she suffered physical violence, malnutrition and abuse by her aunt's boyfriend. Guadalupe's life changed drastically when she joined the **Vida 180** family in Santa Lucia. At first her trauma prevented her from even looking at herself in the mirror. She didn't have a smile on her face and always seemed sad. She felt unsafe and did not integrate with other children. Today she is happy and confident.



31 children are currently part of the family of **Vida 180** in Santa Lucía

Daniel

Little Daniel was abandoned by his mother and ended up living with an acquaintance. A related couple to the acquaintance disapproved that she was taking care of Daniel. The conditions for Daniel did not give him an opportunity to become someone in life. **Vida 180** Santa Lucia is now Daniel's family, where he learned to live with others, to respect, and to be responsible for his education.

The volunteer department invests precious hours into **Vida 180**. Groups of volunteer and individuals have provided valuable assistance in the construction of rooms, yard and installation of irrigation system for the garden. Pre-qualified volunteers regularly contribute to the Vida 180 family at Santa Lucia to provide the employees with respite. They also assist with the children's homework, building maintenance, cleaning, and the planning of special events.

2015 FOCUS

In 2015 our focus was on the Santa Lucia Project. **Vida 180** – Santa Lucia is a home where we accept children between the ages 1-13. These children are rescued off the street or from dangerous family situations. Our objectives are: to rescue the child first and then restore physical and mentally. In several cases we have been able to work with and restore the biological family. However, in over 50% of our cases this is not possible so we focus on restoring and integrating the child into the **Vida 180** family

In Santa Lucia the children grow up in an environment of love: a family that accepts them at whatever level they are at and helps them grow and develop from there. Therefore, we place a lot of emphasis on making sure that we have highly qualified people. Children need mentors and models. Our group of volunteers need to be worthy people that are aligned with our philosophy and our objectives. They need to be positive examples in families, in self-discipline, values and in faith. We are grateful to God for the wonderful people that have come forward who willingly invest time, energy and resources into our kids. Some volunteers help out during weekends, others assist with tasks such as, cleaning and maintenance of facilities, etc...

The new building was inaugurated on May 28, 2015. The facility has been built to provide comprehensive care for 25 girls and 25 boys. Currently we have 13 boys and 17 girls part of the Vida 180 family in Santa Lucia.

One of our goals is to provide education and training allowing children and young people to achieve a career and become productive leaders in our society. One of our goals for 2016 is to complete several classrooms on the second floor of the Santa Lucia home, where we will provide the children with additional education. Our goal for the children is that they grow up to be compassionate and productive citizens, therefore it is very important to teach responsibility at an early age. To encourage the development of responsibilities, we plan to build a small farm where each child can learn the responsibilities in taking care of an animal.

In Santa Lucia we evaluate the physical, mental, spiritual and moral development of the children in a consistent manner. We are committed to providing a balanced life and provide direction for their lives.

PROJECT SANTA LUCÍA

Currently 31 children are part of the Vida 180 family at Santa Lucia.

Vida 180 Santa Lucia is a home in the village of Santa Lucia which recues and restores children. The new home was opened in May of 2015 and has room for 50 beneficiaries: 25 girls and 25 boys. At Santa Lucia our focus is to rescue and restore the child, always looking out for the physical, mental, moral and spiritual wellbeing of each child. Our goal is to restore each child to their biological family but in more than half of our cases this is not possible. When this is not a viable option we seek to work with the mom of the child/children to prepare them for our Las Alamedas program where we work with and hire the mom to take care of her own children. We believe it's God's plan that every child should grow up in a home and not in an institution. If we are unable to integrate them back with biological family in any way then they are eligible for our Calle Central project where we plan to place children in a home with a mom and dad and 7 other siblings.

AGRI 180 PROJECT

We believe that the best way to revolutionize a community for good is when each individual brings their talents, skills and abilities. Economically, Agriculture is the most important activity in the municipality of Cuauhtémoc. It is also the main source of income for the cost of operation in **Vida 180**. We have a group of investors called Agri 180 who do joint ventures with local farmers. Agri 180 provides the seed and fertilizer to the farmer and the farmer plants, tends and harvests the grain for the good of the community and an investment in eternity. This is a wonderful opportunity for local producers of corn, beans, cotton and wheat to positively impact the future of the State of Chihuahua and in heaven.

- Build several houses to rescue vulnerable women.






